


Early drop offs and Late Pick ups

Lately we have been having to assist a number of children whose parents are often late to pick them and for staff who are placed in the position of having to ascertain after school arrangements. The first point I would like to make is that school concludes at 2.55pm and if you intend picking your child up after school, this is the time that parents should be here to do so. Secondly, it is not safe to suggest that children play in the playground until parents arrive. Our playgrounds are busy with parents and children immediately after school, meaning those children in need of supervision are hard to identify.

Should you be running late or have misjudged traffic on the odd occasion, please contact the school so that we can instruct children to wait

in the office for you to arrive. However, if your circumstances mean you are unable to pick up your child at 3pm on a regular basis, we have an after school care service that provides a safe environment for children after school. Enquire at the school office should you need to access this

A few verses in Matthew and Luke tell us all we know about St Joseph. They provide just enough information to demonstrate why he was the divine choice to become the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. Joseph was genealogically perfect for these roles. A distant descendant of King David, he gave Christ the King his royal lineage. Joseph also came from the right hometown. He was from Bethlehem, the city that Scripture predicted would produce the messiah (see Micah 5:1). And as a carpenter (see Matthew 13:55), Joseph was poor—Christ's condition of

Estuary Science Tidal Discoveries

The students in Whanau Rush and our STEM student leaders enjoyed their first science experience in estuary monitoring today. They used authentic scientific methods to collect data about what plants and animals are living in our local estuary. This data will be used by scientists and the Regional Council as part of their ongoing research into the health of our Tauranga Harbour environment.
