Malaga 2019 - Mission trip to Samoa



On Friday 4th October, A large group travelled to Samoa for seven days to represent St Mary's Catholic Primary school and our parish community. Led by Ben Fuller, Teresa Rush, Sister Emeli, Ati and Charlie Aaifou-Olive, 26 students and their parents as well as two grandparents, 55 in total. We are thankful to the Board of Trustees supporting the trip which was initiated by Ati and Charlie Aaifou-Olive. After 18 months of fundraising and preparing it was very humbling to finally be heading off to Samoa.

On Saturday to start our Mission we visited the Samoan Victims Support Group (SVSG) a non-governmental organisation set up in Samoa in 2005 to support victims of crimes and the most vulnerable populations through advocacy, casework, shelter for children, community awareness and violence prevention programs.

This was a very emotional visit and the students certainly learnt that hope in God changes lives. That the good work of those who bring joy, peace, hope and love to those who suffer has a major impact on the dignity of others and their lives. We gifted the very generous donations received from the community including, sheets, underwear, other clothing and a Vege Pod.

On Sunday morning we attended a breathtaking Mass at the Catholic Catherdral in Apia. The Cathedral building was so beautiful we all felt blessed to be walking on the Holy ground. The liturgy of the Mass took our students by surprise, the singing and respect for the sacredness of Mass was awe-inspiring and something the students keep talking about since we have got back. The parish welcomed us in Christ's name with open arms. On Monday we visited St Mary's Catholic School, Savalolo. They welcomed us with singing in Maori, Samoan, a Siva dance and were fed by a huge feast of popo and food. Students visited the classrooms, sharing NZ culture and about our parish, school and Cluny charism. We presented the school with sports gear and drink bottles.

Tuesday we went to Marist Brothers, Apia, where we were welcomed again with beautiful singing and entertainment. Students again visited classrooms sharing about our school and taking part in lessons. Then had a massive rugby game with the students on the field. Once again we were given a lovely lunch. We presented to the school rugby balls and a rugby uniform for the rugby team.

We thank our community who supported our mission, especially ITM Mt Maunganui who donated six thousand dollars worth of sports equipment. Other major donors included the Pacific Island Community Trust Tauranga, Uniform Shop, Vege Pod, Taumeasina Resort and Samoan Airways. Also thanks to Samoa Airways who allowed us extra luggage.

We also would like to thank the Parish and School community who also generously supported our fundraising events.

Excitingly the group was in the Samoan Observer (local newspaper) three days in a row. They reported on our Mission and St Mary's Catholic School. A lovely way to connect with more people in Samoa and to spread God's love. This also enhanced our students learning into how Faith is such an important aspect of daily life in Samoa. This trip most certainly supported an enhanced the School's Catholic Character and was a way for students to live the Gospel in their actions and prayer. Proud to be Catholic.




If you have left an item on route 806c or 807 please contact Bethlehem Coachlines on 571 0360.
