# Main Learning Concepts

Importance is placed in the first weeks, on intentionally building whanaungatanga, a sense of being connected and belonging. Our learning cycle will focus on 'Identity and Wellbeing' with our big learning idea being; A New Way Forward- Can One Person Make a Difference?. Learning will involve inquiring into our big idea and integrating this as much as possible into everything we do. We will be exploring our environment and learning about the world we are a part of and how our actions can affect our local environment in a positive or negative way.

## Forest Discovery:

During week 7 St Mary's Whanau classes will be visiting Mclaren's Falls Park on a guided walk through regenerating bush, with stops along the way to investigate some of the fascinating connections between the plant and animal species that live there. Basic ecology concepts will be introduced, and students will take part in native bird monitoring to assess the health of the forest, bird populations and pest numbers. Biodiversity protection is a focus with students taking part in a pest control programme involving over 100 rat traps. *If you are able to assist on this day, please contact your child's whanau teacher.*
